



Tredyffrin Democratic Candidates Walk The Walk, Talk The Talk



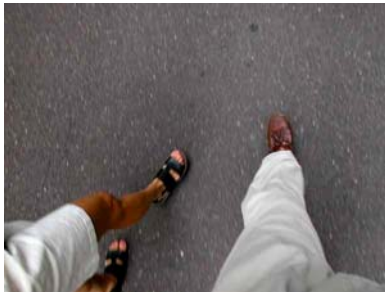
Leaving Footprints
